Syria, Ukraine, Gaza: Is international law in tatters? Does the law of the jungle hold sway? With the Nuremberg Trials a new chapter in the history of international law began after the Second World War. And after the Cold War, a rule-based world order appeared realistic. But that is not the reality of the early 21st century, and not just since Russia invaded Ukraine. Israel's reaction to the massacre on 7th October also begs questions. International law today appears to be in ruins, brute force seems to prevail, and the global community seems to be settling into cynicism or resignation. Safferling's treatise is concise, competent, personal, and passionate. It encourages those who refuse to follow the path toward a civilizational abyss.


Hamed Abdel-Samad, an Egyptian-German political scientist, and Philipp Peyman Engel, the son of a Persian Jewish mother and a German father, swap letters about the situation in the Middle East. They discuss controversial matters, such as: Is Israel committing genocide in Gaza? Do the Palestinians want to wipe Israel off the map? Which side is Germany on? Do many people underestimate the meaning of 7th October 2023? How might a resolution to this conflict look?





Hamed Abdel-Samad studied English, French, Japanese, and Political Science. He has worked for UNESCO and held a professorship in Islamic Studies at the University of Erfurt and at the Institute for Jewish History and Culture at the University of Munich. Abdel-Samad is one of the most profiled Islamic intellectuals in the German-speaking world. As a result of his taboo-breaking autobiography an official fatwa was placed on him in 2013. Since then, he has lived under permanent police protection.

Philipp Peyman Engel, born in Herdecke in 1983, grew up in the Ruhr region as the son of a Persian-Jewish mother and a German father. He studied philosophy, education, and literature and media studies in Bochum and Essen. The journalist is the editor-in-chief of the weekly newspaper *Jüdische Allgemeine*. In 2023, he was awarded the title 'Editor-in-Chief of the Year.' Texts by Engel on Jewish life, anti-semitism, and Israel are published regularly in *SPIEGEL*, *FAZ*, and *Deutschlandfunk*.



A square that makes history come alive Stuttgarter Platz in West Berlin is more than just a location - it's a living archive of Germany's turbulent 20th century. From the decadence of *Babylon Berlin* to becoming a centre of the black market to sanctuary for war refugees, from its days as a red-light district to becoming the cradle of the student movement or the hub for underground culture in the 1980s.

The author traces the vibrant stories and iconic figures that shaped "Stutti," including the legendary Babalu bar and the filming of *The Hooligans* (*Die Halbstarken*) starring Karin Baal and Horst Buchholz. The famed "Elefant" café was long run by Leo Fischmann, a concentration camp survivor, while counterculture icon Rainer Langhans moved into a grand old apartment nearby.

Stuttgarter Platz is where Germany's major political and cultural currents converge.






