

Ever since Eckart von Hirschhausen was able to observe penguins on a cruise, he has known that they sussed it – the right life! What caused his insight? Hirschhausen had looked with pity at one of the small round animals in a chic tailcoat. Somehow, the little penguin appeared unwieldy, slow, and fragile on land. But then it jumped into the water and began to dance, to hunt, to move through the water at the speed of an arrow and in the most agile manner. That was the point when he knew: That animal is in its element. And it's only there that it can fully develop. From that point on Hirschhausen couldn't shake off this idea: What if we just need to find our element? Instead of wasting our energy on fighting our weaknesses and ultimately remaining no more than mediocre, we should find out what we are really good at and work to improve.

Russia's war, the Hamas' war and Israel's military response, China's aggression against Taiwan, and the conflict with the West. Failures from Merkel's 16 years in office raise questions. Here's the answer.

Germany is disappointed and Merkel's policies have failed in many fields: Russia, energy, defense, integration. The climate-friendly reconstruction of the fourth-largest economy has stalled. What looked like stability and what Germany was envied for internationally was frequently patched together.

While writing this book, Eckart Lohse talked to numerous politicians about what drove Merkel and what slowed her down. His insight: Adaptation for the sake of maintaining power shaped her government's action. She lacked the ideas to lead the country into the future.



Eckart Lohse, born in 1963, studied Political Science, Modern History, and Romance Philology in Bonn. He wrote his dissertation in Paris and Munich about France and the division of Germany in the 1950s. He was an editor at the *FAZ*; and from 2003 to 2014, a leading political correspondent for the *Frankfurter Allgemeine Sonntagszeitung*. Afterwards he returned to the parliamentary editorial office of the *FAZ*, which he has been leading since 2018.




The unimaginable has occurred: War is back – and it is threatening us all. Was the long peace in Europe just a brief interlude? Are we doomed because we simply cannot counteract our warlike nature? It's high time to trace the evolutionary roots of violence. These three best-selling authors set off to tell a different kind of history of humanity. They present current research on chimpanzees and bonobos, trace the archeology of murder and manslaughter, and show how war has made despots and states, but also great gods. Their message: We are not condemned to war, but if we are not careful, we can easily fall victim to it.

Harald Meller is one of the most prominent archaeologists in the world. As a state archaeologist for Saxony-Anhalt, he saved the Nebra Sky Disk from criminal circles despite considerable personal risks. Meller wrote the bestsellers, *The Sky Disk of Nebra*, *Reach for the Stars*, and *The Mystery of the Shaman* with Kai Michel.


Kai Michel is a historian and literary scholar. Working with Carel van Schaik, he read the Bible as a *Diary of Humanity*; together they presented an award-winning analysis of the invention of gender inequality in *The Truth About Eve*, and explained why we are living in a state of emergency in *Being Man*.

Carel van Schaik is a behavioral scientist and evolutionary biologist. He researches the roots of human culture, cooperation, and intelligence in apes and spent many years observing orangutans in the jungles of Indonesia. He was professor at Duke University in the USA and professor of biological anthropology at the University of Zurich, where he was director of the Anthropological Institute and Museum as well.


