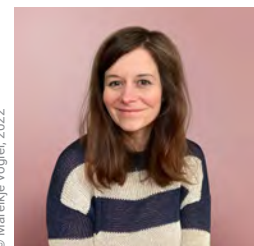
Nothing's calm, nothing's right

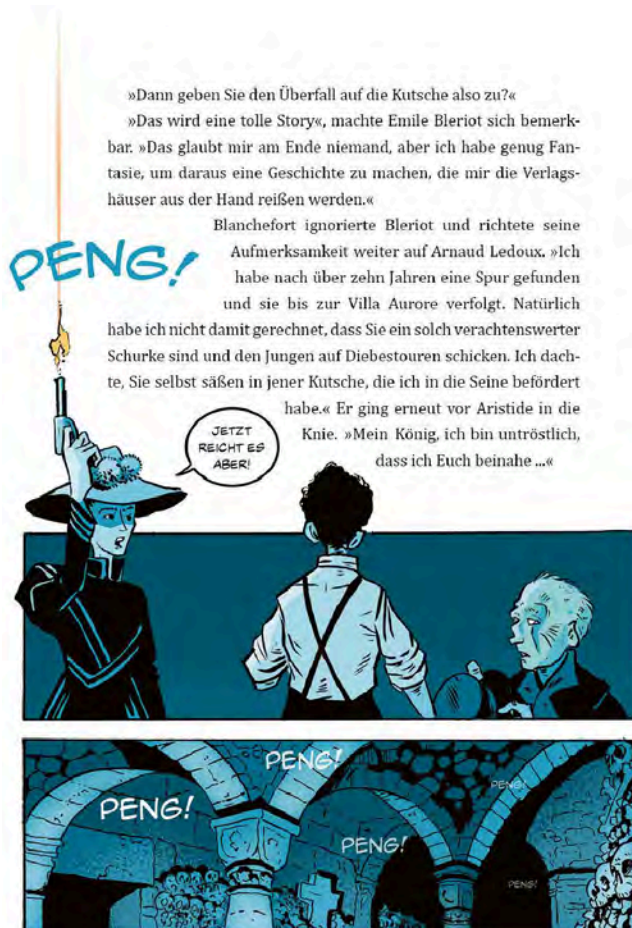

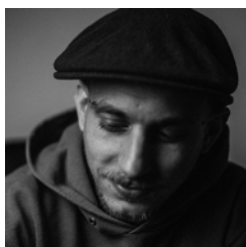
Who is Aristide Ledoux?

If you take a closer look at your daily bread – or your daily fruit & veg – you realise how little you know about them. This ABC does not only present factual knowledge about the growth and harvesting of various edible plants but also explains where they originally come from and how they made it onto our plates. Large-format, detailed pictures render the facts almost tangible. This book can make the whole family look at food with new eyes.
