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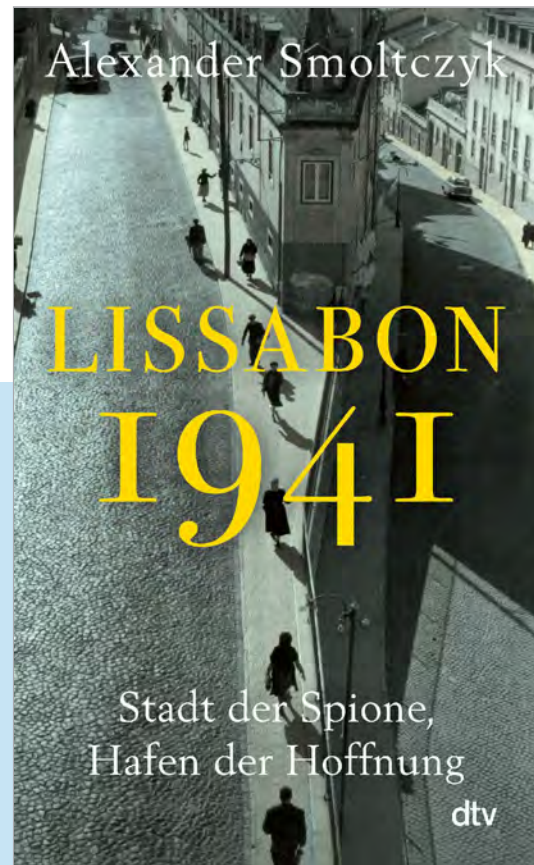
Alexander Smoltczyk: Lisbon 1941 – City of Spies, Port of Hope

In early summer of 1940, thousands of refugees arrived in Lisbon, hoping for a passage to the US, South America or even to England. Also in Lisbon, German agents and British spies watched each other warily, uncertain about double agents in their midst. German buyers tried to purchase large quantities of tinned sardines for Hitler’s hungry Eastern Army and, more importantly, the rare and irreplaceable tungsten for their steel industry, which, of course, the British knew and counteracted. In between, local clans had their sights set on unexpected earning opportunities, while the Portuguese dictator Salazar balanced on a tightrope between all parties.

With aplomb, Smoltczyk brings to life the war-time meeting place of exiles, agents and the battle over sardines and tungsten.

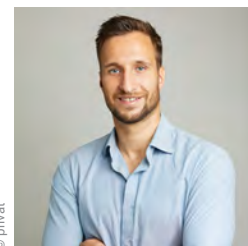

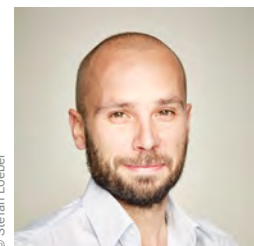

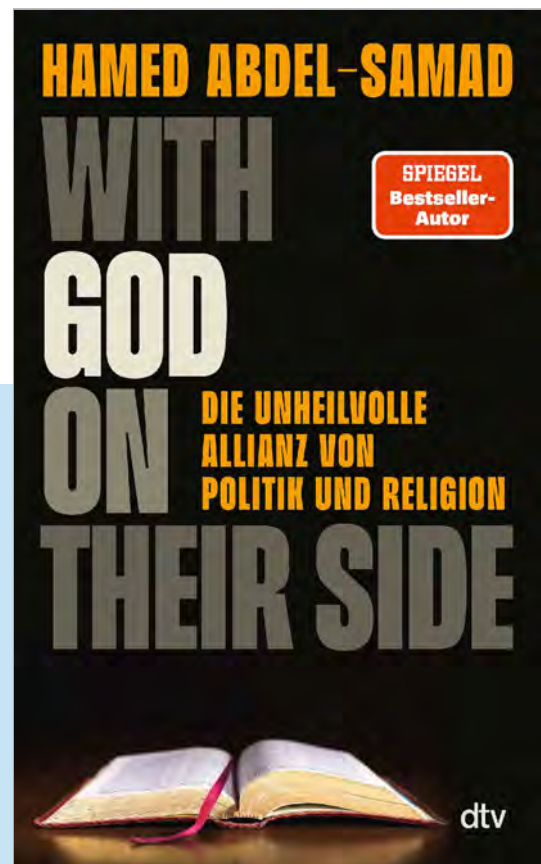

The alliance of power and religion is putting liberal democracies under global pressure. Authoritarian governments around the world are joining forces with fundamentalist movements. This is not a new development in the Islamic world. More surprising is the extent to which Putin's invasion of Ukraine is supported by the Russian Orthodox Church. 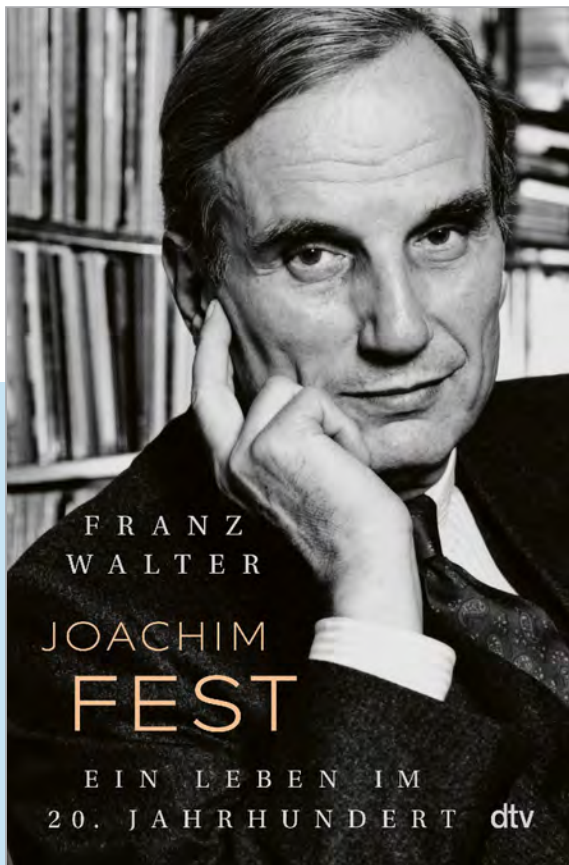

 Joachim Fest was one of West Germany's great intellectuals, member of the Flak generation, best-selling author and editor-in-chief of the *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung*. Yet he always saw himself as a loner, resistant to the whims of trends and the spirit of the times. He clashed with Jürgen Habermas, Günter Grass and Walter Jens. And he worked tirelessly at fashioning himself as last in a long line of bourgeois traditionalists, diverting attention from his social ascent from modest beginnings. Initially a nonconformist, he eventually became a conservative and life-long opponent of the 1968 generation. Franz Walter, a political scientist and historian, had access to his entire estate, including all of Fest's letters. On this basis and thanks to other archival findings, he was able not only to paint a portrait of Joachim Fest but of West-German intellectualism.

Franz Walter, born in 1956, was a professor of Political Science and the director of the Institute for Democracy Research at the University of Göttingen until 2017. His research focuses on the history of political milieus, parties, youth movements and the significance of charisma in politics. He has also published articles in the *SPIEGEL*, *FAZ*, *taz*, *DIE ZEIT* and *SZ*.

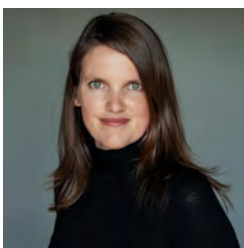

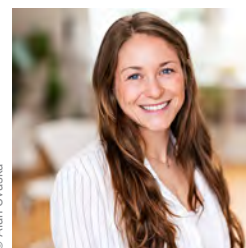

What matters more in life than living?

A minor sports injury turned into a disaster for inline speed skater Laethisia Schimek when an error was made in her medical treatment. Following a collapsed lung and internal bleeding, she was on the brink of death. Even after her hospital stay, she was plagued by breathing problems and panic attacks. But then, she fought her way back to the top. Eight months after her traumatic injury, Laethisia finished third in the 500-metre race at the European Championships and subsequently became the World Games champion in 2022. 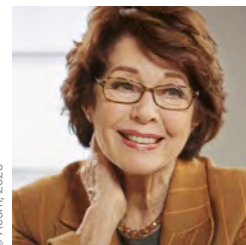

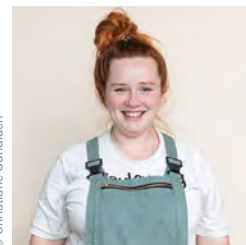

Shortly after buying a derelict house, Cindy wedged her filthy mobile phone between a can of Red Bull and the mess of her construction site, pressed record and started talking. 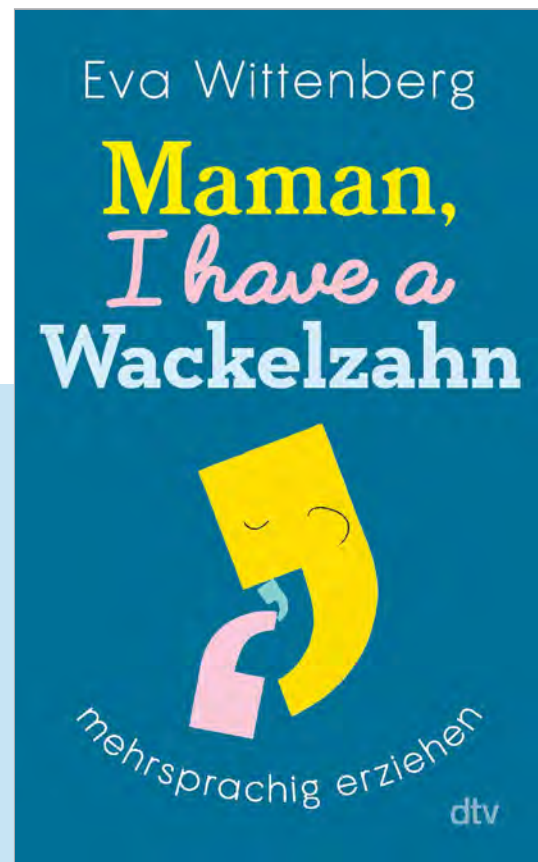
Multilingualism is useful, but above all it is a gift

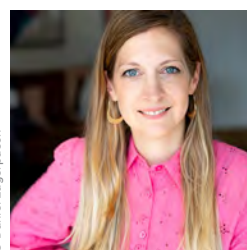

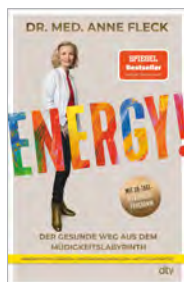

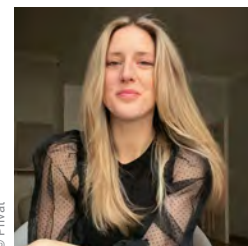
